Chair Robert Swain announced that he and Vice Chair Drew Sidaris visited the pool and they are excited and looking forward to the pool opening.

Vice Chair Drew Sidaris announced the tall ships will be here November through December 12th; December 1st is a lighted boat cruise; December 2nd is the official lighted boat parade; December 3rd is the paddle boat parade at Tidelands park; and, the Winter Bird Fest is the weekend of January 12th.

Chair Robert Swain announced that the Santa house will be open during the 12 days of Winterfest and that everyone should be on the lookout for the caroling trolleys during this time.

Sports Supervisor Karen Sweeny announced that youth basketball assessments are this weekend held at Los Osos Middle School. We are also looking for sponsors and coaches for youth basketball. Sweeny also announced that December 2nd is the Holiday Tree Lighting at City Park from 3:30 – 5:30 p.m. Immediately following is the lighted boat parade at 6 p.m. December 3rd is the paddle parade which has a \$10 entree fee and an opportunity to win an award. There will also be a free boat making craft area for the kids. December 10th is the elf-on-the-shelf event where Recreation Services will be selling hot chocolate and baked goods.

Chair Robert Swain announced that there is a \$20 entrée fee for the lighted boat parade and a \$10 entrée fee for the paddle parade.

Recreation Services Manager Kirk Carmichael announced the Advisory Board Recognition Event is Monday December 4th from 5:30-7:30 p.m. at the Morro Bay Yacht Club and at the next

city council meeting they will be discussing the Recreation and Park commission bylaws regarding the numbers of commissioners and meetings held per year. He also mentioned the Advisory application process will be opening soon and that Commissioner's Swain and Cox terms are completed in 2018. Carmichael also announced that the grand opening of the pool was back in October and that the city is set to offer programs for the community starting January. City programming will be scheduled quarterly once MBHS PE and Athletic schedules have been set and will attempt to provide as much consistency as possible. For January through March, we are planning Monday – Friday three early mornings and five noon times and at a future time for evenings and weekends. He also mentioned we are in the hiring process for lifeguards and an aquatics coordinator. Carmichael also announced that the next city activity brochure should be coming out in January. He also discussed the Bocce court project and specifically that he is working with the MB Senior's to determine funding and maintenance.

Carmichael introduced Teen Program Coordinator Sydney Bliss. Sydney Bliss introduced herself saying she graduated from San Francisco State with a degree in Parks and Recreation, lived in the bay area for eight years and was working with various city recreation departments. Sydney also said she is excited to be working here and looking forward to taking on more responsibilities with the teen center.

RECOMMENDATION:

SUMMARY:

The following is a brief review of the status of current Recreation Division projects and programs.

Estero Bay Community Radio – The Rock 97.3

Staff can be heard on The Rock 97.3 every Monday at 8:10 a.m. Staff is using this time to promote our programs, activities, facility rentals and special events. Staff invites various community groups that support recreational elements to join them on occasion.

City Website/Recreation and Parks Pages/Facebook

Staff continues to add content and update web pages as needed, including calendar items such as program sign-up dates. The department uses the City's Facebook page to announce program registration, upcoming events and other important and interesting information as it arises.

Community Activity Guide

Staff has updated information to existing pages and has forwarded to printer for layout. Ad sales continuing. Guide expected to hit the stands sometime in January.

Recreation Classes

Recreation Services continues to offer a variety of classes for youth and adults ranging from Karate and Tennis lessons to Quilting and Music Appreciation. Staff is looking at adding more classes particularly for young children and the senior population. We also introduced a new Zumba class – an exercise-dance class in which participants can each work out at their own aerobic level.

Special Events

Recreation Staff worked together to put on our annual Holiday Tree Lighting on Saturday December 2nd. The event had about 100 people in attendance, who all were welcomed with cookies and hot cider as they enjoyed a festive afternoon in City Park. Our program included performances by Violinist Bill Alpert, Kids' Club's Children's Center, and MBHS Chamber Choir, as well as a visit and reading from Santa Claus, Ms. Claus and their elf. The event ended with the lighting of the tree and a meet and greet session with Santa.

Recreation Services worked with MB Tourism, and a contracted event coordinator, to program the City's holiday activities. Along with our longstanding Lighted Boat Parade and Christmas Tree Lighting ceremony, Morro Bay held a Winterfest which included 12 days of various activities. Recreation staff assisted with the Paddle Parade on December 3 and with the Elf on the Shelf and Snow Day on December 10.

Morro Bay Senior Citizens Inc. (MBSCI)

January brings the big event of the year for the seniors. The inaugural 55+ Health and Wellness Faire is being held on Saturday, January 20th. All areas of health and wellness will be available to the participants. More than 30 vendors will be representing all areas specific to this event. Presentations, giveaways and healthy food will also be available. Event is free

January marks the beginning of the Winter Cuesta Emeritus Classes. Enrollment is growing and we have expanded from the four original classes to nine offerings this quarter. We will be adding a new class in Restorative Yoga as well as bringing back a favorite, History Seminar with Gary Kuhn. The new classes will complement the returning Watercolor, Acrylic Painting, Classic Mythology and Art History classes in addition to the culinary-favorite cooking class.

Spring Adult Softball League

Spring Adult Softball league registration will begin January 29 with the season beginning March 19.

Brian Waterbury Memorial Rock-to-Pier Run and Half Marathon

The 2018 date will be July 14 with an 8:30 am start. Planning is underway and registration will begin April 30.

Estero Bay Youth Basketball

The season began this past weekend. We have 32 teams with children in 2nd through 8th grade playing. Thank you to all the wonderful volunteer coaches, they give selfishly of their time to the children in our programs.

Winter Aquatics Programs

The pool opened to the public on January 9. We are offering lap swim in the early morning 3 days a week (5:30-8:30 am Tues/Thurs/Fri) and midday 5 days a week (Mon-Fri 11:15-1:30). Aqua Zumba is on Tues and Thurs at 7:15 am, and Masters Coached swimming will be on Tuesday, Thursday and Friday mornings from 5:45-6:45 am. Swim passes are available for purchase at the pool or the recreation office or you can pay for drop in.

Coast Girls Softball

Registration for the 2018 season has begun. Coast Girls Softball is open to girls ages 5-14. Our league is a part USA Softball and we play games with leagues from San Luis Obispo, Atascadero, Paso Robles and Templeton. The USA Softball annual meeting will be held in Templeton on January 28 to discuss changes for the 2018 season.

Kids Club Children's Center

Kids Club is a before- and after-school program for Del Mar Elementary students in Transitional Kindergarten through fifth grade. Kids Club is located on the Del Mar Elementary School campus and is open every day school is in session for before- and after-school enrichment.

Kids' Club enrollment is full, as of now, but we have a waitlist for parents if they are still interested. We have 22 children enrolled in the before school program, 17 TK and Kindergarteners enrolled in the Kinder Kids program, 40 children enrolled in the after-school program, and 47 enrolled in the Drop-In Program.

Kids' Club had the opportunity to perform at Morro Bay's Annual Holiday Tree Lighting. The kids chose their own songs, practiced the dance moves and words, and even made their own costumes. The kids were honored to be part of such a great event, they plan to be part of it again next year.

Kids' Club was closed for Winter Break from December 22nd to January 5th.

Rockies – The Morro Bay Teen Center and Skate Park

The Rockies Teen Center just held "Snowed In" a hot chocolate party. The event took place at the Teen Center from 5pm to 10pm and the festivities included a cookie decorating, a gift unwrap challenge, and candy cane card competition. "Snowed In" was a success with an attendance of over 25 teens.

Rockies Teen Center is a safe and healthy alternative for local youth and is open to all teens in grades 7 through 12. The Skate Park is open to all ages, and helmets are required. Rockies is open from 3 to 7 p.m. weekdays and 1 to 5 p.m. Saturdays. On an average day, 25 teens use the center to do homework, hang out with their peers, and have fun in a safe environment.

Morro Bay Teen Action Club (TAC)

The TAC volunteered to help distribute flyers for the seniors first annual Health and Wellness Faire. The TAC is also gathering volunteers to help with the Chamber's annual dinner nearing the end of January.

RESOLUTION NO. 65-17

**RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL
OF THE CITY OF MORRO BAY, CALIFORNIA
AMENDING THE CITY OF MORRO BAY ADVISORY BOARDS
HANDBOOK AND BY-LAWS REGARDING APPOINTMENT AND QUALIFICATIONS OF
MEMBERS AND MEETING FREQUENCY FOR THE RECREATION & PARKS COMMISSION**

**THE CITY COUNCIL
CITY OF MORRO BAY, CALIFORNIA**

WHEREAS, to ensure all Advisory Board Members are familiar with and understand the City of Morro Bay's philosophies and policies regarding serving on an Advisory Board, and to establish consistency throughout the by-laws for all commissions and advisory boards, the City of Morro Bay adopted the Advisory Boards Handbook and By-Laws on August 12, 2002; and

WHEREAS, the Advisory Boards Handbook and By-Laws for the City of Morro Bay is a composite of the City Council actions, policies, references, and information regarding the City Advisory Boards; and

WHEREAS, the current By-Laws for each Advisory Body establish the number of voting members and qualifications; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to amend the Advisory Boards Handbook and By-Laws for the Recreation & Parks Commission to reduce the number of Commissioners from seven to five; and

WHEREAS, the Recreation & Parks Commission has requested the number of meetings held annually be reduced from eight to six per year, held in odd-numbered months, as was the practice prior to the adoption of Resolution No. 18-16.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the City Council of the City of Morro Bay does hereby amend the following sections of the Recreation & Parks Commission By-Laws to read as follows:

NUMBER OF MEMBERS AND APPOINTMENT

The Recreation and Parks Commission shall be comprised of five members. Appointments and the filling of vacancies shall be made by the City Council. Commissioners shall serve at the pleasure of the City Council.

QUALIFICATIONS

Four of the five members must be a resident and registered voter of the City during the term of appointment, unless excepted by State Law or Council approved special requirements. Unless otherwise approved in accordance with Council Policies and Procedures, section 6.6.1, each member must (i) be at least 18 years of age at the time of appointment and (ii) not be an Elected Official, Officer, or Employee of the City of Morro Bay. (See Council Policies and Procedures, Section 6.6.1.)

PROCEDURE

Regular meetings shall be held every other month on odd numbered months on a regular schedule. The meetings shall be open to the public. The date, time and location along with the meeting agenda shall be noticed in accordance with Government Code Sections 54970-54975. The Chair may close meetings to public comments, provided that action is consistent with the Brown Act. Agendas, reports, meetings and any and all actions shall be governed by the requirements of the Brown Act, as amended.



SUBJECT: Program Evaluation – 2017 Annual Holiday Tree Lighting

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended the Commission review and accept the program evaluation for file.

SUMMARY:

The Holiday Tree Lighting is a family orientated community event hosted this year by Council Member John Headding. Violinist Bill Alpert started the event off with holiday music and guests were offered cookies, donated by the Morro Bay Seniors Inc., and cider to enjoy. The children of the Kids' Club Children's Center performed holiday songs and the Morro Bay High School Chamber Choir also performed and led the community in a sing along. The Morro Bay Fire Department delivered Santa Claus, Mrs. Claus, and his Merry Elf. Santa Claus read "Twas the Night Before Christmas" to all the children gathered around the City Holiday Tree and then allowed time for each child to have a personal meet and greet with him. Santa Claus led a countdown and the holiday tree "magically" lit-up marking the close of the celebration.

DISCUSSION:

There were approximately 100 participants at this year's event.

MARKETING AND PROMOTIONS:

Flyers were distributed through town by Recreation Staff and a banner was hung at City Park. The event was also promoted through 97.3 The Rock and our City Facebook page.

Cost Recovery:

This program is classified Basic Service with a target revenue goal of 0-10%. (program costs + support costs). This program meets its target revenue. Please note that staff costs for planning and promoting were not included in this report.

PROGRAM RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. Staff recommends the Holiday Tree Lighting be held on the Saturday of the Boat Parade annually. This is to better serve the community as well as coincide with the Annual Winterfest events.
2. For the 2017 Holiday Tree Lighting, staff used staging by the tree and recommends continuing to do so, staff recommends using portable tables and to set-up the refreshments near the staging area as we did this year. Staff also recommends using a festive background for Santa's stage as we did this year, it added a festive and professional look for all family's photo opportunities.
3. Staff recommends continuing to invite the children of MB Recreation's Kids' Club Children Center and Morro Bay High School Choir to perform, as well as Violinist Bill Alpert. Unfortunately, due to scheduling the White Caps were unable to perform for the 2017 celebration, however we will continue to invite them to perform at our event for the upcoming years. Staff recommends getting additional performances possibly from Del Mar Elementary Band and local dance programs; staff recommends seeking additional performance opportunities to enhance the program.
4. Staff recommends continuing to ask Greenvale Tree Company for assistance in the placement of the lights on the tree, staff also recommends purchasing more lighting for the tree to be added next year.
5. The Morro Bay Fire Department typically delivers Santa and his helpers using a fire engine. Staff recommends requesting Santa and his helpers to be delivered on the historic (classic) fire engine for added dramatics.
6. Staff recommends funding be allocated to raise the quality of the event. Such additions could include seating, performance floor, promotion, and more lights throughout the park and on the tree.

SUBJECT: MBHS Pool Update

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the Commission review and accept for file.

BACKGROUND:

A pool for the Estero Bay community has been long awaited. Over the last 25 years or so, a handful of community based groups have been formed to help spearhead the concept of a pool for the Estero Bay community. Without the needed partnerships to fund construction and operation, these groups have since folded or minimized their efforts.

The passage of Measure D in 2014 allowed for the construction of a swimming pool at Morro Bay High School. With the community in mind, San Luis Coastal School District along with MBHS have been in conversation with the City of Morro Bay discussing community use of the school district's facility.

DISCUSSION:

The new pool is open and in use by MBHS and the community! Following are a few specifics.

Morro Bay Recreation Services Division:

- Met with SLCUSD for pool operations training January 8.
- Is continually working with SLCUSD on operational procedures.
- Began our aquatics programs January 9 (see attached flyer for specifics) in the rain!
- Is in the process of hiring Lifeguards and Aquatics Coordinator.
- Is seeking instructors for aqua aerobics classes.
- Expects to meet with SLCUSD in February to discuss pool availability for April – June.
- Is planning for a “Community Grand Opening” sometime in spring.
