SUBJECT: Program Evaluation – Breakfast with Santa

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended the Commission review and accept the program evaluation for file.

SUMMARY:

This was our third annual Breakfast with Santa. Due to COVID-19 restrictions this event was changed to a drive thru/to go breakfast.

Our event was held on December 19, 2020 from 8:30 am to 11:30 am at the Morro Bay Community Center parking lot. Tickets were \$10 and included a To Go Pancake Breakfast and a drive through the “North Pole”.

Along with the Pancake Breakfast, families got to drive by and wave to Santa and his friends, take a socially distant picture with Santa, and even drop off your letter to the Big Guy himself.

DISCUSSION:

There were 60 tickets sold. (47 preregistered and 13 day of)

MARKETING AND PROMOTIONS:

Flyers were distributed to all kids’ club families. The event was also promoted through our Morro Bay Recreation Services Facebook and Instagram accounts and KSBY.

This program is classified under the Basic Service category, which has a target revenue goal of 0-10% cost recovery of program and support costs.

PROGRAM RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. Staff recommends that we continue to offer events like this for our community. This year many special events were put on hold and because of that we felt it was important to continue this event for our community but make it COVID safe.
2. To keep our event COVID safe we offered a To Go pancake breakfast and made our event a drive thru outside. We transformed the parking lot of the Community Center into a Winter Wonderland and even made a Santa's workshop where the children could take a socially distant picture with Santa. We are taking into consideration, the possibility of keeping our event outside for the safety of all participants.
3. This year due to COVID restriction we were unable to have volunteers. Next year we hope to be able to have our lovely volunteers from Lion's Club and MBSCI help. We want to continue to use volunteers for this event, as it keeps staff cost low and opens the activity to more of our community.

SUBJECT: Program Evaluation – Winter Holiday Hangout

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended the Commission review and accept the program evaluation for file.

SUMMARY:

Recreation Services held a Holiday Hangout for the Winter Holiday break this 2020/2021 school year. All Holiday Hangouts have typically been held at Del Mar Elementary in the Kids' Club classroom; however, due to COVID-19 and the closure of Del Mar Elementary School campus we moved our childcare program to Morro Bay Community Center. Staff provided full-day care and enrichment for children in grades Transitional Kindergarten through 5th for three days during the SLCUSD Winter Break on December 21st-23rd. The day camp featured many exciting winter themed activities from a "Snowed-In" Movie day to a Whoville Olympics day.

BACKGROUND:

In the past, the Department offered day camp opportunities for school-aged children during school breaks. However, the City faced significant budget constraints during the 2005/06 fiscal year and as a result day camps during school breaks (excluding summer break) were eliminated. Since then, staff received several requests for quality care during the school breaks. Recreation Services brought back day camp programs in the Spring of 2019 and it was well received by families.

DISCUSSION:

This year we offered a Holiday Hangout December 21st -23rd exclusively to our families that are enrolled in our Hybrid Childcare Program, Kids' Club. Per COVID regulations, we were only allowed to offer care within our pods. We had 21 children from our current program join us at this year's Holiday Hangout held at the Community Center which is currently our location for Kids' Club.

Families appreciate the Department's dedication to quality enrichment opportunities for children, especially in these difficult times.

MARKETING AND PROMOTIONS:

This program was an extension of our Hybrid Childcare Program, Kids' Club. We only offered care to families that are currently enrolled in our program, as assistance during the SLCUSD Winter Break.

SUBJECT: Recreation Services Division and the COVID-19 Pandemic

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Commission review and accept this staff report for file.

SUMMARY:

As of March 16, 2020, all City facilities were closed to the public. Resulting from this executive order, all classes, activities, sports, aquatics, and events have been cancelled. Some of the City sponsored programs that were unable to take place included all sports (girls and adult softball, futsal, Labor Day Softball Classic and youth soccer), Kids Camp/Club, and events (Floating Easter Egg Hunt; Mermaid, Pirate & Sea Creatures Too Parade; Senior Open House; and, 4th of July Family Fun Day).

With diligent research, some childcare, activities, and aquatic opportunities presented themselves. The first program that was able to launch was the Emergency Childcare for Essential workers, followed by Junior Guards, and finally we added Aquatic programming.

BACKGROUND:

On March 11, 2020, the Director-General for the World Health Organization declared that COVID-19 can be characterized as a “pandemic.” As a result, March 13, 2020 the President of the United States declared that the outbreak of COVID-19 in the United States constituted a national emergency.

Additionally, March 14, 2020 the Morro Bay Director of Emergency Services (i.e., City Manager, pursuant to MBMC 8.08.050A) proclaimed a declaration of the existence of a local emergency within the City of Morro Bay due to the threat posed to the City from COVID-19.

Furthermore, March 18, 2020 the San Luis Obispo County Emergency Services Director further issued a Countywide Shelter at Home Order and Regulation No. 4 for the County of San Luis Obispo that took effect of Thursday, March 19, 2020.

Subsequently, all City buildings including the Community Center and Senior Center have been closed to the public since March 16, 2020 until further notice.

DISCUSSION:

The closure of City buildings to the public changed the course of our daily duties overnight. The financial downturn that resulted from the pandemic has led to pay cuts, demotions, and 70+ personnel layoffs in Recreation Services alone.

In March, the City announced the launch of the Morro Bay Cares program to help those in greatest need who live in the Estero Bay community. Recreation Services was the hotline for this service. Staff assisted folks by working with Meals on Wheels, Del Mar Elementary food distributions, and the City's VOAD group who focused on basic needs such as groceries, medications, and other necessities. At the launch of the program, residents Marty and Roni Lomeli headed up the coordination of grocery lists with shoppers and medication distributions. The program later transitioned to City staff for grocery coordination and to Rotary for medication pick-up/delivery.

In June, after 3 months of coordination, the program shifted into Morro Bay Connects. This program connected local volunteers with the few citizens that were still in need of assistance. As the program shifted from Cares to Connects, all of those that participated in the program received a care package that included personal protective equipment (PPE) items such as gloves and masks. The bag also included a resource page that included local resources such as Los Osos Cares, Community Resource Center and Morro Bay Fire's RUOK program. These items were distributed to help educate our citizens to the new normal in a safe, healthy manner.

As our essential workers continued to provide services through the pandemic, childcare was still a necessity. Primarily offered to essential workers, and as businesses started to open back up, childcare opened for those non-essential workers as well. This program morphed into Summer C.A.R.E as an enrichment program for children. Stringent cleaning, hand washing, temperature checks, and screening upon arrival were some of County Health requirements. These healthy habits ensure safety and good health for the children and staff. Due to the success of the program, these guidelines paved the way for subsequent activities such as Junior Guards and Aquatics.

CONCLUSION:

Recreation Services has seen a significant amount of change in the Division in the wake of the COVID-19 Pandemic. As the rules continue to change as the severity of the pandemic, Recreation Services will continue to monitor changes and adapt programming to best serve the community.
