SUMMARY:

The following is a brief review of the status of current Recreation Division projects and programs.

Administration

As we begin to move out of the COVID-19 restrictions, interest and demand are already here for activity classes, sports, and use of City property. We have received numerous requests for facility, beach, and park use for weddings, parties, sports activities, and other special events. We are looking forward to Surf Competition Season February where we will be hosting the SLO CAL Open which is a qualifying event for the World Surf League. This event showcases to the world how great our surf is as well as our beautiful beach, Rock, and town. This will be followed up by our long-standing local competition, The Big, Bad, and Ugly. Additionally, and unfortunately, the annual MB Winter Bird Festival was cancelled this year due to the virus and we are looking forward to having them back in 2023.

City Website/Recreation Pages/Facebook/Instagram

Staff continues to add content and update web pages as needed, including calendar items such as program sign-up dates. The department uses the City's Facebook and Instagram pages to announce program registration, upcoming events, and other important and interesting information as it arises.

Community Activity Guide

Our guide has been put on hold due to lack of staff and program content.

Park Development

Our Bocce Ball/Greenhouse project has been put on hold due to the pandemic; however, we are in the process of bringing the project back this spring with renewed effort. New staff in our Public Works office will work on a new design which eliminates the greenhouse (decision by MB in Bloom) along with simplifying the courts for cost savings.

Staff met with other City officials to resurrect the grant application offered by the State of California Department of Parks and Recreation. Discussion took place, community meetings held, and new tasks assigned. An updated application will be submitted this month to the State for funds to replace the restroom at Coleman Park and seek funds for greater development of the Coleman Park area.

Facility Improvements

Staff is working on improvements to the MBCC including framing and hanging the recently donated MB Dowdle Puzzle, removal of the MBCC dedication plaque to be relocated outside and replaced by an interactive monitor, and completion of the Auditorium East wall project from damage caused by a water leak in 2017.

Aquatics Programs

At the end of the month, we are excited to be offering American Red Cross Lifeguarding course in partnership with Morro Bay High School's Career Technical Education classes. Participants in this course will be eligible to be hired as pool lifeguards immediately upon completion. The Lifeguard Certification includes Lifeguarding, CPR/AED for the professional rescuers, First Aid, Epi and Asthma Training, Emergency Oxygen, and First Aid for the Public Safety Personnel (T-22). First Aid for Public Safety personnel covers the CPR and First Aid beach guard candidates need for the LSA Beach Guard Academy. This is an exciting program for not only our MB aquatic community but the county as a whole! We hope that continuing this program helps to inspire the next generation of professional rescuers, alleviate the lifeguard shortage that all facilities are feeling, and builds a water safer community.

The Morro Bay Aquatic Center Winter programs are back in action! The maintenance window was completed on time and successfully. Lessons will return in February and will come back with a revamped registration process. We are excited to announce that we will be offering mid-day master's swim Fridays from 12:30 - 1:30pm, in addition to our current master's swim schedule of Monday and Wednesday 6:30am - 7:30am. Lap Swim and Aqua Aerobics Schedules will remain the same, which are a big hit and in high demand as a safe workout.

Estero Bay Youth Soccer

The 2021 Estero Bay Youth Soccer League was held from August 23, 2021, through November 9, 2021. There were 193 boys and girls ages 4-14 participating. Our Under 6 and Under 8 divisions were coed and combined with teams from Cambria to host games in Morro Bay. For our U10 and U12 divisions we played interleague with South Bay (Los Osos) and Cambria teams. For the under 14 division, we combined with teams from Atascadero, Templeton, and South Bay to host the season. The season culminated with an end of season tournament for the U10, U12 and U14 age groups. Morro Bay Recreations Services hosted the U10 Boys and the U12 Boys tournaments.

We also have 2 all-star soccer teams that will compete in the Santa Maria All-Star soccer tournament. Our boys under 12 team has 12 players and our girls under 10 team has 11 players.

Estero Bay Youth Basketball

The Estero Bay Youth Basketball League is now fully in season as we approach the second week of games. We held a preseason meeting for the coaches of our 34 teams on November 23rd to outline holding our basketball season outdoors for the first time ever. Coaches were given equipment, team rosters, season expectations and instructed to start practices as soon as they were ready. We combined our teams with Cambria's to accommodate players from neighboring communities that otherwise may not have been able to play. Not including Cambria's players, we have 257 youth in grades 2-8 playing basketball.

Estero Bay Girls Softball

We will begin our girls' softball registration on December 15th for the 2022 season. Players in the "Estero Bay Softball League" area (Morro Bay, Los Osos, Cayucos, and Cambria) will have a chance to play in their local league after not having the ability to do so in 2021. We look forward to a triumphant return to play in 2022.

Morro Bay Junior Lifeguards

As was done in 2020, we offered our 2021 JG program COVID style. As we move into 2022, we are seeking a new Coordinator to lead our young staff and participants in another outstanding summer season. Decisions on format, staffing, equipment, and registration are currently underway.

Brian Waterbury Memorial Rock to Pier Run

We have selected July 16 as a date for 2022 Rock to Pier Run. We will look to set up registration and promote the event through marketing soon.

Morro Bay Seniors

January brings new hope that this year will be better than the last one! After a slow start when we reopened in June the participation numbers reached pre pandemic numbers by December. Many seniors are already excited to start the new Cuesta classes, which begin January 18 and we are expanding the course selection this semester by adding Yoga to the schedule. MBAA...55+ has also seen a resurgence in membership and currently has over 600 members and growing daily. The new year will also feature the continuation of our health series with presentations already scheduled in Dementia recognition, meditation techniques and a new phone service available to benefit seniors.

Kids Club Children's Center/Kids' Camp

Kids' Club closed during the Winter Break, but Youth Services hosted Holiday Hangouts. We ran two different camps, Holiday Hangouts: Winter Ed. And All Sports Ed. The first week the kids had the chance to make gingerbread houses, enjoy a pajama, movie, and popcorn day, and celebrated the New Year with a Happy Noon Year Party. The second week we introduced our first collaboration between the Youth Services and Youth Sports at our All Sports camp. Campers were introduced to our benchmark youth sports and taught the fundamentals, learned skills, and had the opportunity to compete in each sport. We look forward to hosting more sports camps in the future.

Kids' Club resumed on Monday January 10th, and we look forward to a healthy and fun second half of the school year.

Our Winter Community Classes are back! If you want to learn a new skill or start the new year off on a healthy start, come out and try one of our classes. All classes can be tried out on a drop-in basis, come out and start the new year off right!


Rockies – The Morro Bay Teen Center and Skate Park

Coleman Park Overview

Overview of Coleman Park

- Already draws many visitors, including tourists and local community members
- Proximity to major attractions, including the Embarcadero, Morro Rock, and Morro Rock Beach
- Crossed by a multi-use path
- Near a launch point for water-based activities, such as kayaking
- Recently demolished restroom due to structural issues
- Rarely used basketball court with large footprint and unattractive fence
- Underimproved/underutilized

Staff has identified Coleman Park as priority area for improvements



Grant Opportunities

Staff conducted survey of potential grants for Coleman Park

- Per Capita Program
 - Anticipated award of approximately \$177,000
- Regional Parks Program
 - Cities not eligible
- Rural Recreation and Tourism program
- Clean California Program - CalTrans
 - Staff considering application

Amenity Suggestions

Numerous amenity ideas were received, including:

- Stage/concert space
- Natural and native gardens
- Picnic Tables
- Historical monuments
- Cultural and educational interpretive signage and plaques
- Art component and/or sculptures
- Improved ADA accessibility
- Additional BBQ stations and fire pits

Staff used the top 5 amenities suggestions received from community input process to develop the conceptual plan:


- Playground areas
