SUBJECT: City Council Work Session – Water Reclamation Facility (WRF) Program Overview

DISCUSSION

The City of Morro Bay established the following goals for the new WRF in December of 2013:

- Produce tertiary, disinfected wastewater in accordance with Title 22 requirements for unrestricted urban irrigation in a cost effective manner for all ratepayers.
- Design to be able to produce reclaimed wastewater for potential users, which could include public and private landscape areas, agriculture, or groundwater recharge. A master reclamation plan should include a construction schedule and a plan for bringing on recycled water customers in a cost effective manner.
- Allow for onsite composting
- Design for energy recovery
- Design to treat contaminants of emerging concern in the future
- Design to allow for other possible municipal functions, i.e. City Corporation Yard on site, as well as other uses, such as public park and education center
- Ensure compatibility with neighboring land uses

In February 2014, the Morro Bay City Council adopted a further goal: to have a new WRF operational prior to the expiration of the discharge permit for the existing WWTP, being five years more or less.

The City's work plan has been developed and refined over the past 18 months to meet these goals. Mike Nunley and John Rickenbach, Program Manager and Deputy Program Manager, will present an overview of the program schedule and major activities, focusing on tasks within the first year. The objectives of stakeholder outreach, and recommended approaches for each focus group, will also be discussed.
