Hello Dana,

I'm writing you in regards to an email that I received just this morning about my background information for submission to your counsel to be used in reference to the open position on the Morro Bay Harbor Advisory Board to which I applied.

I have been working on the research vessel SURVEYOR, owned by Maritime Logistics based out of Morro Bay. We have been working on military operations which preclude the use of the internet, e-mail, and texting abilities.

I feel somewhat put at a disadvantage in this situation since there was no mention or request for such information in the formal release put out by the city about the vacancy application process.

Had I known of such a requirement or had it been listed in the formal notification of vacancy put up at a city of Morro Bay I would have been happy to submit a statement and would have further liked to have had the opportunity to submit additional statements from professional and local acquaintances who asked me to apply for the Advisory Board position. Since I really don't have time to adequately prepare these written materials for submission, as we are currently underway back to port I'm hoping that the council members will accept this statement of intent and attachment of my professional resume for their consideration. We will be arriving in Port in Morro Bay on Wednesday morning and I am more than available to speak with anyone who might have any questions for me regarding my application for this position is manifold.

1. Service to my community.
2. To become more knowledgeable of the day to day workings of the issues which affect our harbor.
3. To assist in finding alternative options for the betterment of the residents and local maritime and fishing businesses in our area, while continuing to make visitors welcome.
4. To become active in finding a way to cease the hemorrhaging of tax dollars by the MBHP and balance the department budget, with the ultimate goal of reducing the draining of the incomes of waterfront business entities.
5. To assist in a reversal of what I perceive of as a current atmosphere of selective enforcement and prosecution of citizens by the MBHP.
6. Being proactive in the formulation of a written set of legal, fair, and viable rules of activities that can be utilized by all of those who work and live on our shared waterways.

Regarding the June 26, 2018 Minutes, I am asking for a correction to my comments for Agenda Items 10-A and C-1.

Regarding A-1, I asked 2 questions which I believe are not accurately reflected in the proposed Minutes.

The proposed Minutes state, "Betty Winholtz spoke regarding Item A-10, asked for clarification on the roles for the educational group and the Quintana Champion." Reviewing the audio of the meeting, the 2 questions I asked were: (1) What is the role of the 3 educational institutions involved (MBHS, Cuesta, CalPoly)? (2) Have the businesses on Quintana been notified of the street disruption when laying pipes for the WRF, and what role will the council member designated as their "Champion" play in regard to the street disruption?

Regarding C-1, the proposed Minutes state my comment to be: "Betty Winholtz voiced concern about using City Council and PWAB as only voice and would like to see quality as a priority. Ms. Winholtz also spoke regarding the population and usage." For clarification, I request the insertion of the following 4 italicized words, "Betty Winholtz voiced concern about using City Council and PWAB as only voices *representing public opinion* and would like to see *water* quality as a priority. Ms. Winholtz also spoke regarding the population and usage."
