



City Manager's Update

June 3, 2019

Typically, I use the opening section of the City Manager's Update to discuss important upcoming City/community events or meetings, and highlight great achievements or efforts underway by our City staff that help improve the quality of life in Morro Bay. However, given the recent tragedy that took place in the City Hall of Virginia Beach, I feel compelled to use this space to express a more somber note.

Twelve lives were cut short on Friday, May 28, 2019, when an employee of the City of Virginia Beach opened fire inside the main government building of the City. Those lives and those of their families, their colleagues, first responders and the community of Virginia Beach are forever marked by this senseless violence. Mass shootings have become all too common in our Country and no easy solutions seem available to put an end to them.

As the City Manager of Morro Bay, this incident has shaken me to the core as I worry about a horrific incident like this playing out in our community. I take the responsibility upon myself to ensure our employees are prepared to respond to an active shooter situation. Just as important, the City and community members alike must do what we can to **prevent** a tragedy like this from ever happening here. With that in mind, if you notice a friend, family member, or community member struggling emotionally or mentally, please extend a hand and encourage them to get help. And, if you sense that something is not right and appears to be an imminent danger to you or the community, please contact the Morro Bay Police Department.

We must take care of each other and work together to keep Morro Bay safe.

Public Works

Water Reclamation Facility (WRF) Program Update

The City is making progress on several fronts regarding the Water Reclamation Facility (WRF) program, including nearing completion of design for the advanced treatment facility, permitting the overall program, and working with the state on a low-interest State Revolving Fund (SRF) loan and grant.

WRF Permitting

The California Coastal Commission will consider the consolidated Coastal Development Permit (CDP) for the WRF program during its July 2019 meeting. The City will host one more public input opportunity on June 11, 2019, during the regular City Council meeting (5:30 p.m. at the Vet Hall), prior to the CDP going before the Coastal Commission in July. That July Coastal Commission public meeting will be held in the San Luis Obispo area in order to provide a greater opportunity for robust public input from Morro Bay residents. The City will post details about the Coastal Commission meeting on the City website as soon as the specific date, time and location has been established for the WRF item.

Permitting work for water quality is on-going with the State and Regional Water Quality Control Boards. More information to come.

Project Review by City Council and Advisory Boards

The Citizens Finance Advisory Committee (CFAC) and City Council separately reviewed the most recent WRF Program Monthly Report on May 21 and 28. Some of the key highlights from the report are that the total project budget is now projected to be \$124.5 million (down from \$126 million) and the project is slightly behind the original projected schedule, but still on time to meet the Time Schedule Order requirements to complete the project and have the plant up and running by early 2023. In addition, the City has been able to gain access to the Dynegy/Vistra and PG&E sites (on the former Power Plant site) to help complete EIR Addendum work.

The WRF Citizens Advisory Committee (WRFCAC) will meet on Tuesday, June 4, 2019 at 3:00p.m. at the Vets Hall to discuss the 30 percent design for the pipeline conveyance system for the WRF Program. In addition, the WRFCAC will review a component of the second phase of the hydrology work for the injection wells component of the WRF Program. This work is helpful in determining the best location for injection and how much the City can expect to extract from groundwater for potable reuse following injection of highly treated wastewater.

WRF Funding Update

Staff who oversee the California State Revolving Fund (SRF) program are recommending the City receive up to \$105,000,000 in SRF funding (low-interest loan and a grant of \$5M) in Fiscal Year 2019/20. If approved by the State Water Board in June 2019, the City could potentially reduce water and sewer rates, depending upon the amount received. City staff will analyze the potential rate impacts and present that information to the CFAC and Council once we have more information.

Work continues with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's WIFIA program to meet their technical underwriting requirements to complete the process to receive the WIFIA low-interest loan.

Finance

The Proposed FY 2019/20 Budget to go to Council for Approval on June 11, 2019

The Proposed Budget reflects a total City budget of \$67.1 million with General Fund expenditures of \$14.3 million (both numbers excluding transfers). General Fund revenues are budgeted at \$13.4 million (excluding transfers in), and an additional \$1.4 million in transfers for total General Fund revenues of \$14.8 million. The budget reflects modest revenue growth, relying on the economy to remain steady as the City's primary revenue sources (Transient

Occupancy Tax, Property Tax and Sales Tax) are highly economically sensitive in nature. In summary, the proposed budget incorporates funding for 97.1 Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) positions, in addition to temporary hours to provide critical services to the Morro Bay community and includes capital expenditures totaling \$37 million, of which \$33 million is for the Water Reclamation Facility (WRF) project.

The FY 2019/20 budget was approached with the intent of being mindful of our future while meeting the needs of today. We were pleased to be able to meet limited staffing and operational needs without impacting the General Fund, while also keeping our eyes on the future. We have significant work to continue in FY 2019/20 to enhance existing revenues and identify new revenues, while exploring cost savings opportunities. We have focused heavily on economic development, specifically collaborating with the Chamber of Commerce and our business community partners as economic stability and revenue diversification are an identified goal of the City Council. City Council will review the FY 2019/20 Proposed Budget for adoption on June 11, 2019, at 5:30 p.m. in the Vets Hall.

Harbor

U.S. Lifesaving Association Training Academy

The Harbor and Recreation Departments recently completed this year’s United States Lifesaving

Association (USLA) Training Academy to train this year's batch of new Lifeguard and Junior Lifeguard personnel. Beach Lifeguards began staffing over the Memorial Day weekend and will be on weekend-only duty until mid-June, when schools are out and summer really gets into swing. Seven-day a week coverage will continue through the Labor Day weekend, after which they will go back to weekends-only through the Harbor Festival weekend. Beachgoers are reminded to always swim near a Lifeguard, and don't hesitate to ask your local guards for the latest beach and other information.



Army Corps Visit and Annual Dredging Underway

United States Army Corps of Engineers Los Angeles District Commander Colonel Aaron Barta paid a visit to Morro Bay with his top staff on May 23. Colonel Barta was touring the northern reaches of his command to meet local partners and address any outstanding dredging or other issues, and took a bay tour with Mayor Headding, City Manager Scott Collins and Harbor Director Eric Endersby.

The Corps of Engineers dredge ship YAQUINA arrived in Morro Bay on May 28 for her annual harbor dredging. She will be here through June 14. Dredging will be concentrated in the harbor entrance area to ensure our harbor is safely passable during winter months and high surf, although some interior dredging to about the Target Rock area may take place. Mariners are reminded that most of the interior harbor channel markers from the entrance to the North T Pier are removed for the dredging, and therefore the navigation channel is not marked.

Contact the Harbor Patrol, Coast Guard or dredge ship for information if necessary. Harbor Patrol and Coast Guard can be contacted on marine channel 16, and the dredge, while they do monitor 16, works on marine channel 13. The YAQUINA's shore launch is not in operation, so the Harbor Patrol has been busy assisting the crew transport personnel and supplies back and forth to the ship.

Morro Bay Firefighters Prepare for Fire Season

Already this week, our County's fire agencies responded to a grass fire in east San Luis Obispo County that burned over 1,000 acres. In Morro Bay, you will see firefighters conducting mandated performance evolutions and training. This year's schedule includes an additional 30 hours of training to prepare our team for a season that is guaranteed to bring extreme weather, dead and dying trees, and challenging fire behavior in our community and state. It's that time of the

year again, and residents of Morro Bay are encouraged to get an early start on weed abatement. The Morro Bay Fire Department mission, through its Weed and Vegetation Abatement program, is to eliminate vegetative growth and/or refuse which may constitute a fire or life and safety hazard. The weather in April and May varies greatly from year to year and rain can be common after property owners have cut their parcels. However, it is important to the overall safety of our community that property owners maintain their weeds/seasonal grass to 4" in length year-round so we can prevent small fires from becoming large. As the owner, you have the responsibility to abate any fire hazards or conditions that may exist on your property by **June 15, 2019**. Fire Department Personnel will start their inspection program June 16, 2019.

City of Morro Bay Abatement Guidelines

- # Clear annual grasses and weeds on empty lots to no more than 4" high by mowing (disking or rototilling is not permitted).
- # Remove dead bushes, tree limbs, excess trash, wood and other combustibles. Side and backyards shall be abated.
- # All cuttings within 10 feet of adjoining properties, streets or sidewalks must be removed and sidewalks, gutter and street areas shall be left clean. No piles or clumps shall be left on the property; however, finely cut material may be scattered, providing, the above requirements are met and material will not blow onto adjoining properties or street areas.
