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Dear City Council:

Here are some thoughts to consider as you review the Staff Report.

I'm unclear why this statement is included in the report when the city manager has the discretion to spend thousands of dollars more than \$2,000 without Council: "Staff may need to return to Council for a budget authorization for this unanticipated City expense, particularly if costs were to exceed the \$2,000 estimate above."

Please remember this started out as a pilot program and continues to be a temporary program not yet approved by the CA Coastal Commission. Therefore, the funds should not be seen as a permanent source of money for the Harbor Enterprise Fund. This program was conceived in 2019, so I am wondering why the actual financials from that time forward are not part of Fiscal Impact report. They were part of an early report that came to Council.

In addition, the Harbor Fund continues to be balanced, what is needed are capital funds that are more appropriately sought through state and federal grants.

Finally, and obviously, the voters would prefer addressing this sooner rather than later, so the June ballot would be preferred.
