A LOOK AT WATER USE IN SLO COUNTY COMMUNITIES

The table below shows how much water was used by all of the customers in each municipality, as well as by the municipality itself, for the first six months of 2013 compared to the first six months of 2014. The figures are shown in acre-feet; an acre-foot of water is equal to about 325,850 gallons.

...So is Morro Bay Conserving water?

There are three water purveyors in Cayucos, and this number represents only a third of the customers in the community that are served by the county, Most of its customers are residents; most of the businesses in town are served by another purveyor.

^{*}Golden State Water Co. serves 2,674 customers in Los Osos, nearly half of all the community. The rest are served by the Los Osos Community Services District.


This number represents water use for most, but not all, of San Luis Obispo's parks and facilities. Some of the water being used at parks is also recycled water.


